### Thought for the month

Our house in Milverton is situated opposite a rookery. They are sociable birds but better known for their noise; I understand that their collective noun is a "Parliament"! I was once advised that if I was ever too far away from a bird to be able to distinguish between a crow and a rook, if the bird was alone the chances are that it is a crow but if surrounded by others, a rook. They are the birds first willing to announce the imminence of dawn, although two days ago a blackbird was singing happily and volubly just after five thirty in our back garden.

This time of year is full of the promise of spring. The days are lengthening and away from the easterly wind, the air carries the promise and warmth of spring. One of the poets that I would like to have included in my Lent course was John Clare, arguably the finest poet of the natural world that we have in English. His poem, "All nature has a feeling" is a good example.

"All nature has a feeling: woods, fields, brooks Are life eternal: and in silence they Speak happiness beyond the reach of books; There's nothing mortal in them; their decay Is the green life of change; to pass away And come again in blooms revivified. Its birth was heaven, eternal is its stay, And with the sun and moon shall still abide Beneath their day and night and heaven wide".

The poem reminds us that the decision of the Church to celebrate the Resurrection of Christ in the springtime was deliberate. Nature provides us with an annual reminder of the power of life over death. As Clare asserts, for nature, its "decay is the green life of change". When death occurs, inevitably it will "come again in blooms revivified".

It would be both unlikely and disappointing for a priest to express doubts about the Resurrection. However, my belief in it is not confined to what we are told in the New Testament or what is expressed in the Creeds of the Church. My belief in the Resurrection of Christ from the dead is not limited to the testimony of others; I am persuaded of its truth by my observation and appreciation of the natural world where new life and re-birth is a reality.

If we are part of the world in which we live, if we are truly creaturely along with all those other species made by God, it is part of our nature that we should perish. However, only by and through death can we experience resurrection; the "eternal" about which Clare writes so eloquently.

With my best wishes for a happy and blessed Easter.

## **Country Matters**

Mid February There was a small amount of frog spawn in my ponds, but there is much less spawn to be found in ponds and ditches each spring. This is now of grave concern as our amphibians are in serious trouble, due to a combination of pollution, habitat loss, increased traffic levels and the outbreak of diseases such as ranavirus and chytrid fungus. Up to 3,000 frog's eggs float in jelly, while toad spawn forms long chains and newt spawn occurs singly.

February is the main month for badger births of up to five cubs. They are born in a chamber attached to the sett, no more than a metre below ground to maximize ventilation. The mother will have lined the chamber with moss, leaves and bracken and the cubs stay for about two months under ground being suckled. The mother will have been mated in the spring with delayed implantation.

Early March The rooks are busy building their nests and fighting over twigs, if not stealing them from other nests. It is said 'nests built in high tree branches mean a sun-filled summer, nests built in low branches mean a rainy summer'. Looking at my rookery I think the rooks are hedging their bets and building at medium height!

Barn owls are also nesting but have no intention of cleaning a nest or lining it with fresh moss. Instead the female lays her eggs on the encrusted bed of ingrained droppings, some of which may be many years old. Ravens are about the earliest birds to breed in the UK. They mate for life and do not need to waste energy 'courting'. They also use the same place and nest to raise their chicks. In the Lake District an often used nest was two metres high and wide.

The buds are swelling and the sap rising in trees and hedges. A green mist is covering the bare twigs. Birch is a very elegant and pretty tree and the Ukrainians name the month of March after them - Berezen, or the time of the birches. The people should be free to enjoy them and to tap the bark for the delicacy of birch juice.

Look out for swallows and house martins, chiff chaffs and many other summer visitors.

## The Ukraine Crisis

We will all be well aware of the Government's response to the Ukrainian refugee crisis asking property owners to register their interest in offering accommodation in their homes, or in an empty property they own, to refugees. Whilst many refugees may want to head to the cities where there is more opportunity to work, in rural areas we have plenty of space, quietness and a friendly community to offer sanctuary and a warm welcome.

A small number of local families have already registered their interest in the scheme. However, one concern, that has been expressed, is that any Ukrainian guests may feel isolated in our rural community. It would be amazing if we could join together and provide a rural hub for refugees, so that they can keep in touch and support each other through this crisis as well as meeting us locals. For instance, they could meet regularly in the Village Shop for coffee and give each other much needed advice and help.

In April, the shop says goodbye to tenants Martin & Sally and a big hello and welcome to new tenant Katie!

### Potatoes (Solanum tuberosum)

### Boil 'em, mash 'em put 'em in a stew.

Being slightly distracted by our impending move, I found it hard to single out and concentrate on a subject for this month - which is ridiculous really. April is the month where so much in the garden starts coming to the fore and one is spoilt for choice.

April is the month when, traditionally, you start getting your 'Spuds' in. This fact and my own thoughts of the upcoming move to our new home along with the appalling events happening in Ukraine kept bringing my thinking around to the very basic plant-based sources of nutrition and sustenance that we take for granted everyday and sometimes woefully underappreciate.

Growing up next door to Kittisford Barton I was surrounded by fields of potatoes (mostly main crop 'Desiree' and an earlier variety which went for canning I believe). I occasionally participated in potato picking over the school summer holidays, though my mother, Barbara and other local women, (you know who you are!) spent endless hours toiling on the harvesting machine, particularly lifting the later main crops, often in very inclement weather.

For my father, Reg, interest in potatoes mostly focused on first earlies - and getting them in as early as possible, often putting black plastic down with a carpet or straw on top and a thick layer of mulch to warm up the soil. There **really** is nothing to beat the flavour of your own extra early new potatoes! I start 2-3 tubers of a variety like 'Foremost' or 'Premiere' off in large pots as soon as they arrive from the suppliers in January, building up the compost level in the pot as the foliage grows. At present, I have the luxury of heated glass to start and force them, giving them plenty of water and dilute liquid feed during April to provide my employer with a plate of new potatoes to go with his first asparagus!

One of the main problems with growing potatoes, particularly organically, in the West Country is potato blight fungus (*Phytophthora infestans*), the spores of which initially infect the foliage and stems, moving down the connective tissues into the tubers causing them to rot in the ground or in storage. The best way to deal with the problem is to pick varieties that are proven to have resistance to the disease and in one case, almost complete immunity.

The 'Sarpo' varieties of potato are the ones to look out for, Sarpo Mira, Sarpo Una and Sarpo Axona being the ones least susceptible to

blight. 'Mira' has the most unbelievable disease resistance along with having a certain amount of frost resistance too.

Do visit the 'Sarpo' website; they are based in North Wales but the story of how the Sarpo varieties came in to being is a very interesting one with its origins in cold war era Hungary. There is so much more that I could write about this fantastic staple crop of our kitchen gardens and its development and history but that's for another day; meanwhile lets daydream of those first new baby potatoes with melted butter *mmm*.....

## Ashbrittle Parish Council Minutes of Regular Meeting held on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> February 2022 at 6.30pm

**Councillors Present:** Charles Doble (Chairman), Jeremy Robbins, Helena Massie, Vicky Hughes.

**Minutes of previous meeting:** The minutes of the previous meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> November 2021 were agreed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

**Matters Arising:** A parishioner has come forward to enquire about serving on the Council and they will be warmly invited to the next meeting.

### **Correspondence Received:**

PCSO Louise Fyne sent her regular reports about crime and other policing matters within our area. The next 'Cuppa with Cops' at Wiveliscombe Silver Street Centre are on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> March and Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> April from 11.30 - 12. Stawley Shop Beat Surgeries take place at 9 -10 a.m. on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> March and Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> April.

# **Reports from Councillors: Highways and Planning** (Charles Doble)

- i) A concern had been raised about the Hele Farm planning development. This concern came after the closing date for comments to the planning department but was noted.
- ii) The conditions of the roads and verges was discussed. Several slippery areas of mud and leaves at the bottom of Ashbrittle Hill to Tracebridge. CD will get a quote for mechanically clearing road edges and passing places by a contractor with sweeper and gully suction.
- iii) CD spoke about his concerns for safety on the A38 in the light of the ongoing problems with road safety, accidents and, sadly, fatalities. Also there are issues with signage, road joining and speeds. Although outside the Ashbrittle area, CD is in discussions at County level, Sampford Arundel Parish Council and other stakeholders. Our other councillors supported him with these concerns.
- iv) HM has surveyed the six fingerposts in the parish. One post has already been renovated and five remain to be repainted. Quotes will be sought by CD.

**Footpaths:** VH commented on the condition of the stile on the footpath at the bottom of Bull's Field. JR will check if it can be repaired.

Finance (Helena Massie) HM presented the accounts to date. The certificate of exemption will be signed by the end of April and HM is preparing the end of financial year accounts for the next meeting. The insurance cover has been renewed for a three-year period. Continuing charitable giving was discussed and no new funding had been requested for specific parish projects. The council agreed to support parish events for the Queen's Jubilee celebrations in June.

### **Any Other Business:**

i) The Queen's Jubilee: JR has spoken to Paul Musgrove (Stawley PC) to co-ordinate local events from Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> to Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June. There are proposed beacon lightings to start the events; in Wellington a street party is proposed on Friday, a fair on Saturday and picnic/music in the park on Sunday.

In Stawley parish /Appley Pavilion, an event is proposed for Friday and Ashbrittle will have an event on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup>/Sunday 5<sup>th</sup>. JR and HM are to form a joint planning group with the support of the council.

ii) JR will replace the vimpel and halyard in the church tower and the parish council will pay for the replacement.

Date proposed for next meeting/Jubilee planning meeting: Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> April.

### **Broadband**

Last month the Parish News had a lovely large advert for the meeting with Airband which was due to happen on the  $10^{th}$  March. Unfortunately, this did not happen because Airband cancelled their attendance due, we now know, to their representative leaving the company.

#### Better news

However, that is the end of the bad news. Councillor Dave Mansell, who is our local District Councillor, has been working hard on our behalf and has had a meeting with Airband. He has discovered that we (the parishes of Stawley, Ashbrittle and Bathealton) are in contract C16 which is due to get fibre to our localities in 2024.

As has been stated before you can register your interest in getting fibre by going to www.airband.co.uk. People who have been doing this in the past month have been finding that they get a call back from Airband very quickly to offer them a 4G system to get faster broadband whilst the fibre is coming.

### How you can help

Please go to their website and enter your postcode to find out whether you are "in contract" for delivery of fibre in 2024. If you get the following message you are in contract:

"Your address is part of the Connecting Devon and Somerset (CDS) funded project"

If, however, you get the response shown below you are **not** "in contract":

"You're one step closer to getting connected"

This is possibly because you live someway from the cable path, but there are cases where the property could be wrongly designated or arrangements could be made for a connection.

Please let me know if you are only "one step closer to getting connected" by e-mailing your address and postcode to stawleypc@cantab.net and also let me know how keen you are to get a fibre connection.

### A joint campaign

Working with Dave Mansell, our District Councillor, who represents all three parishes, we will then collate how many properties are not "in contract" and start a campaign to get them in.



# WOOD TURNER


