## Thought for the Month

"Gather up the fragments so that nothing may be lost". (John 6 v 12)

Despite the amount of money spent on bird food in the Beaumont household (echoes of a good Yorkshire man!), both Ruth and I thoroughly enjoy watching the birds who gather at our feeders.

In the course of the last purchase, Ruth, mistakenly, ordered sunflower seeds with the husks intact, instead of our normal husk-less variety. We have been amused to observe most species happily working their way through the seeds, whilst energetically spitting out the outer casings. These then lie scattered on the ground underneath the feeders, providing nourishment for the less discerning wood pigeons and squirrels. It would seem that what most birds find unappealing is attractive to others, even if, in the case of the squirrels, their presence is unwelcome!

"Gather up the fragments so that nothing may be lost".

We live in an age that has become familiar with the gathering up of fragments. In addition to the usual bin loads of bottles, paper, cardboard and tins, in Milverton we are now provided with an opportunity, once a week, of re-cycling our unwanted plastic. Containers of all shapes and sizes, including the ubiquitous trays provided by food shops, find their way into the lorry that turns up on a Monday morning.

We sometimes forget that plastic has been recycled for decades. Thirty years ago I purchased a snap-tee fleece from the American manufacturer "Patagonia". Although rather expensive at the time, (a friend of mine refers to the firm as Pata-Gucci!), each item is constructed in China, using one hundred recycled plastic bottles.

The Christian faith holds firm to the belief that "nothing is lost". Not only do we put our faith in a crucified Lord whose life's work and ministry involved him embracing death at the hands of those who rejected him, we also believe that only through the tragedy of death can we discover the glory of the resurrection.

The Christian faith testifies to the belief that all the events of our lives have significance. Each sadness, tragedy and disappointment, each joy, triumph and pleasure has a purpose and a meaning.

As Christians, we believe that nothing in our life is wasted. If only we can truly value all that we are given by God, then we might more readily learn to live lives that are full of gratitude.

A friend of mine once went through a period of clinical depression. It struck down a man whose previous demeanour was one of joyful vulnerability. When recovered, he spoke of his gratitude to God for revealing to him the depths that human beings are sometimes called to encounter. For Hugh, his illness was not a fragment to be lost, rather it was gathered up to increase his knowledge and experience of being human, loved and sustained by God.

## Parish News A Commemorative Jubilee Supplement

As you read these lines, you are holding in your hands what I think is the greatest monument to the Queen's Platinum Jubilee as demonstrated by our five parishes. That monument includes the regular editions of *Parish News* that appear each month and also the commemorative Jubilee supplement.

It is not just the skills and hard work of our editors, but the raw material of social engagement that forms the true foundations of our 'monument'. In February 2019 I had occasion to count the voluntary organisations mentioned in that edition of *Parish News*. They came up to 22, plus 57 local businesses advertising their services. All for 700 people.

The list for last month, June 2022, was inflated by Jubilee celebrations although some of them may have displaced regular activities. Allowing for these factors, 54 voluntary organisations plus 43 local businesses advertised their services. The population is still about 700 people.

In February 2019, the list of voluntary organisations included an arts group, a winter blues evening, a book group, Kittisford pudding club, Quaker meeting, Ashbrittle lunch club, Bathealton attic sale, vintage tea in Bathealton village hall, Stawley Community Association AGM, mobile library, spinning and wool-craft group, charity supper club, rambling/Nordic walking, heating oil group, gardening club, doorto-door transport and cricket club annual quiz. Also, but not announced: Pilates, T'ai Chi and Yoga.

In June 2022 the following 'happenings' were reported: Bathealton Plant Sale, Stawley Church Fete, Ashbrittle Platinum Jubilee Tea Party, Appley Pavilion Platinum Jubilee Picnic, Stawley Church Coffee Morning, Avon and Somerset Constabulary Beat Surgery, Stawley Mill Jubilee Picnic and Open Garden, a plea by Somerset Archives and Local Studies Service for records of parish history (the Jubilee Supplement will be submitted), a Quaker Meeting, Stawley Annual Parish Meeting, Raffle for Red Cross Ukraine fund, Ashbrittle Art and Craft Group, Mobile Library, Ashbrittle Village Lunch Club, Meadow Farm Greenham Cream Teas for Red Cross in Ukraine, Gardening Club visit to Malvern and Flower Show announcement, RCI meeting and Reports of Village Emergency Telephone Service 'VETS', Walking Group, Oil Group, Walks Leaflet project, Art and Craft Group, Youth Club; Spinning and Woolcraft Group, Ashbrittle Arts Open Evening, Stawley Mill Open Garden Teas

and crafts, *Having a Larf* entertainment in aid of Rossholme School Kenya, Bathealton Church Flowers. Also, but not announced: Pilates, T'ai Chi and Yoga.


## The Parish News and the Jubilee Supplement

### St Michael's Church, Stawley

It was the day of Pentecost which, as Chapter 2 of The Acts of the Apostles tells us, commemorates the arrival of the Holy Spirit among the followers of Jesus Christ in Jerusalem, fifty days after His resurrection, and shortly after His departure on Ascension Day.

The sun had already risen when Stawley Church was unlocked on the first Sunday of June 2022. The Grade 1 listed architectural gem, that is the ancient Parish Church of St Michael and All Angels, which is situated in this relatively quiet rural area close to the Devon border, was open for business.

A little later, the sound of Church bells could be heard ringing out across the land from the 14<sup>th</sup> Century tower, to summon all to attend the service that day. Meanwhile, the Village Festival Choir were gathering for their final rehearsal. The Church had been beautifully decorated with flowers, with a colour emphasis of red, white and blue.

The congregation started to arrive, were given their service sheets and hymn books, and invited to take a pew in one of the Church Box Pews, which had avoided the Victorian vandalism that had removed them from virtually everywhere else, both nationally and in the area.

As I was handing out the hymn books and orders of service, I became a little concerned that we did not have enough to go around. No problem! I have a stash of spares hidden away. As I was issuing these the congregation just kept coming in and it became apparent that I would need to ask people to share their copies. Finally, with the use of some extra chairs, everyone but me was seated. We were all welcomed by our vicar, the Rev Martin Beaumont, and the service commenced.

The singing of hymns is an integral part of the service of Holy Communion, where Christians take bread and wine in remembrance of Christ's sacrifice upon the cross. Having the choir present gave the service that extra 'oomph' which makes it a so much more enjoyable experience.

Towards the end of the service, the vicar announced the Banns of Marriage of a couple wishing to have a Church wedding. The conclusion of which timed perfectly with the sound of a popping cork, indicating that the refreshments of an appropriately celebratory nature, which would follow the service, were being prepared.

What had made this service so special, was that

it was to commemorate a very special person, a one-off in the history of our land. Never before had any Church in Britain, or in the Commonwealth, commemorated a Platinum Jubilee. The Queen's Christian faith is well known, so to celebrate her 'service' to us, using our 'Service' to God, was most appropriate.

Much has been written about Queen Elizabeth II, and I feel it's best at this point to just let you conjure up your own recollections and observations. So, I will conclude by saying on behalf of the merry band of workers who are also known as Stawley Church PCC, thank you for coming to your Church to attend the service, and for making it such a wonderful and memorable occasion for us all. It was clear to see that everyone there enjoyed it.




