#### **Suddenly**

Does the name of Sydney Sheldon mean anything to you? Maybe yes, maybe no. I had never heard of him until I came across a quote from him. He was a book-writing American from Chicago. His quote was this:

"Life is a very thin thread and it only takes a second to snap it."

Gloomy? Maybe - it depends on how you understand life and its meaning. Whenever the end comes, it is always a second between the final breath and whatever comes afterwards. Why am I thinking about this? Partly because we are in the season of Easter and partly for five other reasons.

Those five reasons are to do with people I've known or heard about. Since the beginning of last November, I have been aware of five men who have died suddenly. One moment they were alive, and the next second their personal thin thread was snapped, as were, of course, the thin threads of love and happiness in their loved ones' lives.

One or two had health issues. Another was a good age, but he, and the remaining two, appeared to be very fit. Outwardly so, at the very least. Whatever the causes, no one suspected it. Why should they? Suddenly they are left with questions, like "Why?" "What caused it?" and "Is that it, then?"

At their Passover meal, the mood was one of impending gloom. Jesus was talking about betrayal and his death, and creating a simple means by which they would be able to remember him. Then he commented, "In a little while you will no longer see me". Perhaps they accepted this as a statement about his death, now close at hand.

Then Jesus added, "Then in a little while you will see me." They were confused. They couldn't seem to grasp it. He had mentioned before that he would be brought back to life. The thin thread re-created? They didn't really accept that bit. It just doesn't happen, does it?

Within three days, they did see him again. His thread of life was restored and wouldn't be snapped again. That was his message and it demonstrated and made them aware that his recreation contained the power to re-give life, albeit on an eternal level.

Because of what happened to Jesus, the history of the world and each human heart has been changed. Everyone has the option to die and die for ever, or die and live for ever. That's fundamental to the meaning of life. For you. For me. For the five men I mentioned earlier, and for those who grieve for them.

"In a little while you will not see me; then in a little while you will see me." The way of death into the way of life. A thin thread broken but then restored for good – made possible only by Jesus and our heart's welcome to him.

To create magnificent structures and Copies of thick bounded books for a string of hope


Hope for something better

#### Something stirs in the Asparagus bed...



I watch in eager anticipation as the first purple-headed spears start to break through the mulch; I started these plants three years ago from seed and hope for, at least, a little taster this year even though I know I should really let them build up their strength for another summer. It has always been an ambition to have my own asparagus bed (I've always been a man of modest dreams...) and Lord knows I've planted and established enough for previous employers and clients. But you do need a suitable piece of ground and plenty of time to nurture and enjoy the fruits of your labours - a quality asparagus bed can, with the appropriate management, provide a sizeable crop for up to thirty plus years!

Cultivated Asparagus (Asparagus officinalis) originates from the coastal areas of the Mediterranean, Eurasia and much of Northern Europe. Records show that spears (the newly emerging shoots from a dense, fibrous crown) were gathered from the wild in ancient Egypt, Syria and also by the Greeks and Romans. The French were the first to select and cultivate asparagus in the monastery gardens of the 15<sup>th</sup> Century.

Most modern variety (one or two year old) crowns offered for sale are F1 all-male forms which are the most productive. Older varieties and seed grown forms can produce both male and female seedlings which can be a little less productive but the main drawback is that mixed male and female plants will produce berries (and thus, seed) which can germinate within the bed and possibly crowd out the established crowns. These berries will need to be removed before ripening and any

seedlings rogued-out as soon as they are seen.

To establish a healthy and long-lived asparagus bed you will need a good, fertile soil with plenty of humus (leaf-mould or well matured compost/ manures) and excellent drainage. Incorporating plenty of grit and sand in preparing the bed and building up the bed into raised rows or mounds on which the crowns are planted is the traditional way.

I have planted mine in a raised bed, constructed with lots of leaf-mould/compost mix and grit with blood, fish and bone meal added. If planting dormant crowns, it's essential that they are kept well-watered during the first year. No spears are harvested in the first year and a maximum of 10% of spears in the second year with full production commencing in the third year. Traditionally, the asparagus harvesting year starts in the UK around the 20<sup>th</sup> April and ends on the longest day. After this, all spears must be allowed to grow and 'fern' so that goodness can be put back into the crown for the following year. It also makes good sense to support the fern with a 'catscradle' of sticks and string to stop stems from being broken or snapped by strong winds.

#### **Autumn management**

The fern can be cut to the ground in autumn when it's fully 'browned'. I usually follow with a good mulch of well matured compost and a dressing of granulated seaweed or chicken manure pellets in spring for that burst of nitrogen necessary for top-spear production. Other than weeding and culture as described, the bed should need very little attention once established. Slugs can be troublesome in wet springs and Asparagus Beetle can cause defoliation and weaken the plants over time.

The old-fashioned idea of asparagus needing salt is a myth; due to it being a coastal plant, asparagus has a very high tolerance for saline conditions but does not need it at all. Granulated seaweed feed is the best in my view but traditionally on the big coastal estates with walled gardens (such as Heligan in Cornwall), they would have harvested seaweed straight off the shore and dressed the beds with it in the autumn.

So, whether lightly steamed with butter or made into a delicious soup, the delicacy of asparagus is well worth the initial time and effort needed for the production of those luscious spears, the true harbingers of spring. And the well-known after-effects of eating it? Ah, the mysteries of the body's bio-chemistry (its all down to the metabolism of certain chemicals into sulphur compounds apparently)...

In my opinion its well worth that too!



#### Busy as a bee



The worker bees are very busy at this time of year, feasting on the nectar and pollen from hawthorn, dandelions, and garden flowers.

The front cover photograph shows sealed brood (shaded grey), with empty cells being cleaned and polished in preparation for the queen bee to lay her eggs, together with sealed food stores (unshaded)

which are in reserve for the hungry young larvae if the weather turns inclement preventing bees from flying.

The eggs take twenty one days to develop and hatch. The worker bees spend the first two weeks of their life on 'hive duties' before joining their flying comrades on outside duties. At the peak of the summer season their lifespan is relatively short because of the vast amount of work they do in such a short time.
