#### **Thought for the Month**

#### On the 8th May, VE Day, we will be celebrating the end of World War II in Europe.

#### Here is an account of one man's experience -Gerald Webb, by his son Gerry.

When the war broke out, my father was too young to join-up. Living in London, he became a runner for the ARP (Air Raid Precautions) and darted around the blitz torn streets carrying messages. He eventually became a fully-fledged ARP Warden.

However, as soon as he was eighteen, in 1942, he went to the recruiting office to sign-up. 'What unit would you like to join?' said the Sergeant. The reply was that he wanted to join the Essex Regiment. The man was so thick that he could not spell Essex and so my father finished up serving for twenty eight years in the Royal Sussex Regiment. It is possible that the Sergeant was getting some kind of reward for everyone he could dupe into joining the much under-recruited Sussex Regiment.

Basic training was a real treat; they were not bombed every night and the food was more plentiful than the meagre rations he was used to at home. After completion of that, he was sent to the Royal Sussex Regiment (stationed somewhere just below the N on the map of Kent). The time came when that nice Mr Churchill thought they deserved a holiday in the sun. So, they were loaded in troopships and finished up in that glorious resort of North Africa. Having sorted out Rommel, as a reward, they were treated to a guided tour of Italy. Monte Casino was one of the attractions they visited although my father missed that as he had a bad attack of jaundice.

#### The next move

As a special treat, the Prime Minister suggested that they might like to leave the war in Italy and go and fight in Greece for six months. They got shot at in Greece, but not as much as in Italy – so they looked on it as a bit of a holiday. However, all good things must come to an end and after that break they found themselves back in Italy.

It is an interesting fact that they liberated Rome on the same day as the start of the D-Day landings. Their casualty rate had been over twice that of the Normandy campaign although they were dubbed by an outspoken American lady in Parliament as 'the D-Day Dodgers'.

The end of the war found them in Austria which was an absolute haven to anything they had experienced in the previous three years. That nice Mr Churchill even threw in a bit of leave back in England. Doesn't travel broaden the mind, especially when it involves a journey of two weeks in cattle trucks across war torn Europe.

#### War-time on the home front

Some of us oldies are still around, born in the 1940s, but even so, mostly too late to have real memories of what it was like to celebrate the ending of the dreadful toll that war had been imposed on our parents' generation. The word Peace must have been such a relief both to those at home and those who had been fighting.

As testified by many poignant war memorials, some villages had lost the backbone of their male population and some families faced a future without their next generation. Those who returned were too often physically and mentally scarred. The promise of peace was a beacon ending the dark days of sadness and uncertainty. A reason to pull out all the stops and celebrate.

Church bells remained silent during the war, only' potentially, to be rung as a warning of imminent invasion. But in 1945 there was a promise of Peace. Before the days of television and wall to wall multichannel broadcast music, the sound of the bells echoing around both country and city parishes must have been truly meaningful. A resounding heartfelt yippee after all the worries of war.

On the 8th May 1945 bells rang out across Britain as the nation took to the streets in celebration of **Victory in Europe Day.** 

#### **Celebration of the occasion**

Eighty years later we celebrate this momentous occasion by recreating that moment to pay tribute to those who made the ultimate sacrifice, so that we might live in a free world.

The church bells will be rung in the early evening of Thursday 8th May in Bathealton, Kittisford, Ashbrittle and Stawley, as they will all over the country.

May our children and grandchildren not have to face the dreadful horrors of war.

#### The summer starts here!

There were many people who put their hearts and souls into making the new Pavilion a building that would stand the test of time and the current trustees do an amazing job to maintain and improve the facilities. Here's to the next twenty years and more.

#### A bit of history

Back in 1995 it was obvious that the old Memorial Pavilion, built in 1952, was not going to be able to be adapted to meet the requirements of new legislation for public buildings, particularly disabled access and toilets.

From a germ of an idea the Parish Council set up a subcommittee to explore grant funding and draft plans for a replacement pavilion. A community survey was sent to every household in the five parishes; the results gave overwhelming support for a new building, along with many ideas for new activities.

Then the real hard work started, culminating in 2002 with the first grants from Taunton Deane and Somerset County Councils. This proved to be the catalyst for Lottery Community Funding and other pots including Landfill Tax Credits (a master class in complicated application arrangements).

During this time the playing field and pavilion were registered as a charity with a new constitution governed by the Charity Commission. By the end of 2003 funds were in place and the painstaking work of agreeing architectural plans and a programme of works began. The old pavilion was sold on eBay to a charity, based in Shropshire, providing holidays for children affected by the Chernobyl disaster. Ground works started in late summer 2004 and, cutting a very long story short, the new building had its grand opening on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2005 *see photograph on page 32*.

How many of the children in the photograph, now young adults, can you name?

As well as returning groups such as Pre School and Cricket the building was soon home to new users; Stawley Youth Group, Pilates, a Young People's Environment Group, The Get Fit class, Yoga, Tai Chi and a venue for Adult Learning and Leisure classes. Here's the trip down Memory Lane from May 2005 to 2025, hold on to your hat and take a deep breath, this is just a snapshot!

Apologies for any omissions and a huge thank you to everyone who was part of this amazing list of events and activities. Not forgetting all the bookings for families and friends.

**Cricket Club** matches throughout the summer season. A huge thank you to the club for maintaining the grounds in such immaculate condition.

Annual Stawley Flower and Produce Show: a regular September event when the best of local produce and crafts is on display.

We are going to organise a few fundraising events ourselves during this week, most notably our closing event:


#### The Big Breakfast in Aid of 'Wivey Cares' Sunday 29th June at Wivey Rugby Club, 9.30 – 12.00

Take it from here, of course. Every journey, task or idea starts from here, where I am. It can't begin from where I'm not, can it? I can't be where you are at the same time.

If something is happening that we don't like, we can hide somewhere, or pretend we are not here. We can't be in two places at once so we can't just miraculously hop into that other place. We have to run for it, get out of the way, move ourselves.

That is precisely what all the migrants are doing. Where they are, there's persecution, or violence, or some other kind of cruelty. Alternatively, they can't fulfil their dreams and ambitions. Life is regulated by corruption and poverty.

As they look across the world, via their mobile phones maybe, they see other countries. They look beautiful. The people are smiling, look happy and life seems many times better. There's an especially nice little island off the west coast of Europe that, they hear, is very welcoming. Getting there involves risks but it seems worth the dangers. So they take it from there to get where they want to be.

#### A better life

Some of us want to make permanent moves for a better life. Maybe escape to the country. Many more go from home to relax and enjoy something – they go on holiday. We migrate to pleasant quiet areas and turn them into tourist hot-spots. Home from home?

But what if what we face is so big we can't escape? Have you heard on the BBC News (so it must be true!) that a largish asteroid is heading our way? Maybe <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> mile in width and coming very, very fast! If it hits us – and it is by no means certain – then an awful lot of Granny's priceless china is going to get smashed. If that is to happen, where can we go?

That's the problem with living in a finite world. Whether it's an asteroid, another but more ferocious pandemic, or climate change becoming unstoppable and destructive, where do we go? Where do we go from here?

### **STOP PRESS**

#### Getting connected in Stawley the first live connection

Like most people living in this area, we have struggled to get a decent broadband speed for many years. We have also had our hopes raised and dashed on more than one occasion with the promise of fibre optic broadband being installed in the area. So, when we heard about Technological Services offering to install full fibre to properties in the village of Stawley we were rather sceptical, but registered an interest anyway. After an interval of just four weeks, I am delighted to say that we are now connected and that Tucks Farm is the first property in Stawley to go live!!!

The whole process was extremely straightforward, requiring a few emails, and a visit from Jim Weir to look at the site and work out where to put the underground duct. The work of getting the duct from our field into the garden and to the house was carried out quickly (but not quietly!) with no mess left behind.

If you haven't registered an interest already, I would recommend this company. The broadband speed is excellent (faster than Starlink); you get connected for free by consenting to the company applying for a government voucher on your behalf.

The monthly price you pay once you go live is very competitive.

#### **Gardening Club**

For our April meeting, a group of twelve went to Knightshayes Court on a visit organised by Penny Stanbury. Here is what she said about it:

The Gardening Club visited Knightshayes Court, after an invitation from John Ridgley. We saw work on the Woodland Garden, originally constructed after WW1, and then neglected for many years. You can imagine the scale of the work involved.

When rejuvenating the beds, we saw volunteers meticulously salvaging tiny bulbs from amongst the weeds. Some overgrown trees and shrubs are being removed. Replanting has involved salvaging plants, donations and micro propagation of some specialities. A large plant donation came from Broadleigh Gardens. We visited these gardens in Bishops Hull last year and we were aware it was for sale. The sale meant all the beds, tunnels and stock had to be returned to field conditions. John was invited to go over with a van to salvage all he could. What a gift! But it meant even more plants to be cared for in his nursery.

Originally, peat blocks were used to create tiering. As peat cannot be used now, they are experimenting with various block forms. Shredded bracken which is coloured by charred laurel is the current thought. It is not expected to last as well as the peat blocks, edges of which we could still see in places.

A lovely walk through some completed beds was enhanced by the dappled sunlight through the mature trees and azaleas.
