

<p>Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) must be rebutted. More vehicles on a road with difficult bends will make an impact on the environment so must be considered in the EIA. The statement in the SOR that “the site ... has no ecological interest” must be rebutted; the surrounding quarry walls possibly have great ecological interest which may be affected by further development on this site. Finally the statement that “there will be no significant impacts associated with socio economic matters” is seen by the Council as totally false. Any further development on this site will impact the local community and must be considered in an EIA.
